

## **AMT 300: Airframe and Powerplant Certification Course**

Savannah Technical College is offering an Airframe and Powerplant Certification Prep Course for aircraft maintenance technicians wishing to take the next step in their career by earning their A&P license. The course will be offered several times during the year with various schedules and covers all areas of the A&P testing requirements including general, airframe, powerplant, and oral & practical.

### **STEP 1: Get your FAA sign-offs**

Call Atlanta, GA or Columbia, SC FSDO (Flight Standards District Office) to speak with an FAA representative about your aviation experience & they will tell you whether or not you are eligible to take the Airframe and/or Powerplant tests. The FAA rep will make an appointment with you to bring your supporting documents, identification, etc. for verification. You will fill out **two** copies of Form 8610-2 and the FAA rep will sign off on both copies. These are **very important**, as they are your permission slips to take the written exams.

### **STEP 2: Register for the Class**

**STEP 3: Attend Class**

Classes will be held either on weekends (Saturday-Sunday 8:00 am – 5:00 pm) or weeknights (Monday-Thursday 5:00 pm – 9:00 pm). Please check the website at [www.savannahtech.edu](http://www.savannahtech.edu), call or email for upcoming course dates. Classes will be held at the Crossroads Campus of Savannah Technical College located at 190 Crossroads Pkwy, Ste 100, Savannah, GA 31407. Written tests are also completed at the Crossroads campus, while the Oral & Practical exam is offered at the main campus at 5717 White Bluff Road in Savannah.

If you are seeking your A&P license, you should attend all 4 weeks. If you are seeking your Airframe or Powerplant license only, you should attend three of the four weeks to include General, either Airframe or Powerplant, and Oral & Practical. If you already have your Airframe or Powerplant license and are seeking to obtain an additional license, you will only need to attend two of the four weeks. (Example: If you already have your Airframe license, you would only need to attend weeks 3 and 4 to obtain your Powerplant license.) If you have already satisfied all the written tests and require the Oral & Practical only, then only week 4 is suggested.

Week 1: **General**

Week 2: **Airframe**

Week 3: **Powerplant**

Week 4: **Oral & Practical**

Once you complete the written exams, you will take the exam test scores & the original FAA 8610-2 forms to the DME (Designated Maintenance Examiner) at STC's main campus on your scheduled test date. Upon completion of your Oral & Practical exams, the DME will keep your test scores & your 8610-2 forms to be sent off to the FAA HQ in Oklahoma City. In return, the DME will issue you a temporary A&P license. In approximately 90 days you should receive your permanent A&P license.

**Costs:** (subject to change)

**Tuition: Four weeks:** \$390 tuition (Full A&P Certification prep)

**Three weeks:** \$320 tuition (Airframe or Powerplant prep only)

**Two weeks:** \$250 tuition (Additional license if you already have Airframe or Powerplant)

**One week:** \$195 tuition (Prep for Oral & Practical exam only)

**Written tests:** \$100 each (General, Airframe and Powerplant)

**Oral & Practical Test:** \$700 for both A&P; \$600 for Airframe or Powerplant, \$500 for add-on license (Total for new A&P license including four weeks of class and all testing is \$1,390.00)

Tuition and testing fees are due one week prior to the first class and are **non-refundable**. Acceptable forms of payment include credit or debit card, money order, or personal or cashier's check made payable to Savannah Technical College.
