## BEFORE you withdraw from a course...

- Have you spoken with your professor about your dilemma? Do they know you are struggling? It is a good idea to speak with your professor before withdrawing because oftentimes, they can help – especially if it's not too late in the semester.
- Will this cause you any financial aid or VA education benefits issues?
- How will this affect your academic plan and graduation date? You may wish to speak with your advisor before withdrawing to ensure that doing so will not negatively impact your expected graduate term.
- Are you in the US on a Student Visa? If so, please see STC's PDSO, International Student Advisor, in Student Affairs BEFORE requesting a course withdraw.

## WITHDRAWAL INSTRUCTIONS

- > Go to the "Students" tab on the STC website.
- Look under the "Forms" heading on the right side of the page.
- Click on "Student Course Withdrawal."

## PLEASE NOTE: Withdrawing is different from dropping. You will not receive a refund for tuition/fees that have been paid.

If you withdraw after the add/drop period (no harm, no foul period) which is the first 6 days of the semester, you will receive a grade of "W".

- A grade of "W" is neither good nor bad, but it will appear on your transcript as a course that you attempted.
- Ws are incorporated in the Satisfactory Academic Progress calculation (<u>SAP</u> completion rate) that the office of Financial Aid uses to determine eligibility for federal aid. Please reference the following information from the "<u>Keeping Your Financial Aid</u>" website:

You must meet the minimum <u>Academic Standing and Satisfactory Academic</u> Progress requirements:

- Overall GPA of 2.0 in current program of study
- Overall completion rate of 67% in current program of study
- Current program must be completed within a 150% maximum timeframe
- If you wish to withdraw with no academic penalty, you must do so <u>before</u> the
  designated date included in your course syllabus.
